<u>Setup a Free Microsoft Office Account</u>: Microsoft offers free *online apps* when you create an online account with Office.com; setup a free account here: <a href="https://www.office.com/">https://www.office.com/</a> look for the text link, "Sign up for the free version of Office"...




Get the Presentation file link from Patriot Academy: Your Patriot Academy: Your Patriot Academy team will share a link to the presentation file from their OneDrive App. The link will open in your free Microsoft Office account within your PowerPoint Online App.





Save a Copy to Your OneDrive App: The PowerPoint Online App will allow you to save the presentation directly to your OneDrive App. From the File menu select "Save As" and then select "Save as... Save a copy online" this directs you to your OneDrive App. Pick a place and press "Save Here" button. (see next step)

## Open Presentation from your OneDrive App:\*

Open your OneDrive app and navigate to the presentation file that you just saved.


The OneDrive App can be listed from the upper left corner button that looks like a bunch of dots in a square shape.

Press Apps Icon button to show all Office Apps






From *OneDrive*, select the file you just saved and it will open in your *PowerPoint Online App*
