
Your Free Account: Includes Apps like *PowerPoint* and *OneDrive*. You will need these two apps to facilitate the *FREE* online




### **OneDrive App** - Used to Store Presentation Files:

Open your **OneDrive app** and upload the files that you downloaded from the Patriot Academy website.

The **OneDrive App** can be found from your **Office.com** account by using the upper left corner button that looks like a bunch of dots.



Once you have the presentation files uploaded to your OneDrive App, you can click on the files to open them in the *PowerPoint* Online App. From OneDrive, select the file you just saved and it will open in your PowerPoint Online App.

A Note to the presenters about *PowerPoint*.

PowerPoint

Microsofts offers two versions of *PowerPoint*. A *FREE* "**Online**" version and a *PAID* version called the "**Desktop**" version.

If you are using the *FREE* "**Online**" version you will be able to present from any location so long as there is an internet connection. You will experience differences in the presentations' performance based on internet connection speeds.

If you are planning to use the *PAID* "**Desktop**" version of PowerPoint, then the presentation would be presented from your computer (laptop, etc.) and would have better performance.

### **Differences Presenting from PowerPoint "Online" vs "Desktop":**

The presentation will look the same from both versions, but will perform differently regarding animations & transitions, sound effects, and video playback.

The best way to prepare yourself for presenting is to practice from the tools you plan to use. That way you will become aware of how the presentation performs.
